Parish Council

The Annual Meeting was held on Tuesday 17 May 2011 and the following may be of interest:

Cllrs. J P Terry, G F Barnett, R H Sword and Mr C H Holmes (Clerk) were present The Cllrs. signed their Acceptance of Office forms.

Lady Downe was elected as Chairman and Cllr. Terry as Vice Chairman for 2011/12

Elected Cllrs. Lady Downe and L S Day sent apologies.

County and Borough Cllr. D Jeffels and Borough Cllr. Jay-Hanmer were unable to attend.

The Clerk reported that he has received a cheque for £250.00 from the National Park Planning Authority towards printing costs for the WRNM Newsletter. (excellent news! – Ed). North Yorkshire County Council may provide some financial assistance but this is dependent on other approved grants not being fully taken up.

There has been no feedback from the County Council regarding the surface water and carriageway issues in Eastgate, Ruston and Cllr. Barnett said the problem is getting worse and should be addressed before next Winter. The Clerk will contact Cllr. Jeffels and the Highways Area Manager for an update and Cllr. Sword will ensure that the Estate considers the matter.

The Clerk reported making objections to the County Council's Public Transport Team about the withdrawal of evening and Sunday 128 bus services. The County Council has replied that there are no current negotiations with other operators to provide a replacement service.

Finance

The renewal of the Council's insurance is based on a three year contract and cover has been reduced to exclude the Council's benches and notice boards given that a £250.00 excess applies to these items.

Members received and noted the summary accounts for the year ending 31 March 2011 and it was agreed to appoint Mrs Margaret Welsh as the Internal Auditor.

It was agreed to leave the Clerk's salary and contractual arrangements unchanged in 2011/12 and the Clerk reported that, from April 2011, HMRC have announced that all Parish Councils must be registered as an employer and operate PAYE on the income the Clerk earns. This will involve a different arrangement by which the Clerk is paid and he will report the details to the next Meeting.

Consultations

The application to build a Wind Farm at East Heslerton was discussed and concerns included visual impact, the effect on existing communities, the need for more detailed planning of the scale and location of wind farms and financial viability. It was agreed to object to the proposal because of the visual impact it would have over a wide area of largely unspoilt countryside.

General correspondence

The proposed withdrawal of concessionary bus travel on services 108 and 109 connecting the Spa and the Sea Life Centre in Scarborough was noted and concern was expressed about another example of a well used and appreciated concession being withdrawn.

Members also noted that the Household Waste Recycling Centres will be closing every Wednesday from 01 July 2011.

The Clerk confirmed that the proposed grain handling facilities at Bedale Farm, North Moor Road, Wykeham have been approved.

It was agreed not to provide financial support for the Good Neighbours Community Transport Scheme.

The Annual Parish Assembly followed this meeting

Parish Clirs. I P Terry, R A H Sword and G F Barnett attended. Also present were Mr and Mrs Carne, residents of Wykeham and PC G Bilton from North Yorkshire Police.

Apologies were received from Parish Cllrs. Lady Downe and L S Day, County and Borough Cllr. D Jeffels and Borough Cllr. M Jay-Hanmer.

Cllr. Terry welcomed everyone and referred to the recent Parish and Borough Council Elections which saw Gordon Barnett elected as a Parish Cllr. and David Jeffels and Mick Jay-Hanmer re-elected as Borough Cllrs. Cllr. Terry paid tribute to Katrina Shamel for her work as a Parish Cllr. and the notes of the last Assembly on 12 May 2010 were circulated. Cllr. Terry proceeded to describe the events of the last year and gave details of the Parish Council's current financial position.

PC Graham Bilton presented the latest Police Report and confirmed that PCSO Michaela Braidley supports him in policing the Derwent Valley where there has been a 50% drop in crime over the last year. There is no longer a distinction between the Safer Neighbourhood Team and Response Teams and the aim is to ensure that the most appropriate Officer attends an incident. Following a restructure, a new shift pattern has been introduced which allows for greater flexibility and with an increased number of Officers on duty at any one time.

PC Bilton confirmed that current priorities involve campaigns to achieve safer roads through action against speeding, bad parking (particularly near some schools) and to deal with poaching, fly-tipping and dog fouling. Metal thefts, including that of utilities cabling and vehicle parts, has become an increasing problem and a recent operation in association with the Environment Agency has targeted suspicious vehicles and scrap dealers with some success. PC Bilton emphasised that members of the public should not confront anyone engaged in this type of activity but should instead contact the Police after taking details of the vehicles involved wherever possible. The problems caused by off-roading have reduced somewhat thanks to a joint effort with National Park Rangers. PC Bilton closed by describing some other recent incidents and Court cases that have resulted in convictions. He was thanked for attending.

Andy Carne then demonstrated the Wykeham Parish Council website that he has designed with his wife Tina whose company is called Four Degrees West Ltd. The website is still a "work in progress" but the aim will be to provide local people with as much information as possible and will include links to other local authorities and organisations. The aim is to have the website live by the time the next WRNM News is published. (see article on Page ? - Ed)

Cllr. Terry closed the Assembly by thanking everyone for attending, particularly Andy and Tina Carne, and for contributing to the discussions.




















Church News

Save our bus service

North Yorkshire County Council, in a bid to reduce spending has withdrawn the evening 128 bus service between Scarborough, Pickering and Helmsley

I feel that this is a great loss to those of us who live and work along the A170, see my email below. If you feel the same please email passenger.transport@northyorks.go.uk

Dear Sir

I would like to express, in the strongest possible terms, my concern regarding the cancellation of the evening 128 bus service.

The 128 bus service is the only means of affordable public transport between Pickering and Scarborough and it's cancellation will result in many no longer having the option to take up work, or participate in social or school events that finish after 6.00pm.

The cancellation of this service will compound the very problems that successive governments have tried to counter - rural isolation, antisocial behaviour of youngsters and lack of access to employment. It may affect a minority of the population, but as usual these are the ones who's need is greatest; who's only option is public transport - those on low incomes, the unemployed, school age, teenagers and older folks.

Could a solution not be found whereby the buses continue to run throughout the day and night as before but at 2 hourly intervals? This would ensure that employment and social opportunities along the A170 are accessible to all.

I hope that the decision regarding the 128 bus service is reconsidered.

The Cricket Club received a major setback recently when their bid for £125,000 grant aid to assist in the building of a new club house was rejected by The Big Lottery Communities Fund. Rather disappointingly for the committee this was the latest in an increasingly long line of rejections. The proposed clubhouse was to be in the opposite corner of the Park to the present building, next to the entrance. The club has planning permission and architects drawings for the new building. The reasons given for refusing the application were largely that the club did not sufficiently show how the building would benefit groups in the community other than the cricket club.

It should be pointed out that the Cricket Club would be delighted for other groups to use their facilities, providing that Dawnay Estates were in agreement, and in fact have encouraged schools to use the ground for cricket tournaments. It was at one time suggested that a new pavilion could be modified so that the building could also be used as a village hall however this suggestion was not taken up because of the nature of the access to the site from the A170.

The club had also future plans to install a hard court tennis facility for use by the local community although this matter has been raised only tentatively with the land owner at this stage.
